On 13 Jan. 1696, he was *cr.* by his father James II (when in exile), DUKE OF ALBEMARLE, EARL OF ROCHFORD, AND BARON OF ROMNEY, (a) and was placed in command of the Toulon fleet designed to invade England. He was, in 1702, made a Lt. Gen. and Admiral in France. He *m.*, 20 July 1700, Marie Gabrielle, only child of Jean d'AUDIBERT, COUNT OF LUSSAN, in Languedoc, by Marie Françoise, da. of Henri RAIMOND, SEIGNEUR DE BRIGNON, also in Languedoc. (b) He *d. s.p.m.s.*, (c) 16/27 Dec. 1702, at Bagnols in Languedoc. His widow *m.*, (d) at St. Eustache, Paris, 25 May 1707 (without the knowledge and much to the displeasure of her parents), John (DRUMMOND), 2nd EARL (titular DUKE) OF MELFORT [S.], who *d.* 29 Jan. 1754. She, who was *b.* about 1675, *d.* 15 May 1741, at St. Germain en Laye.

II. 1721. 1. GEORGE (GRANVILLE), BARON LANSDOWN, (1712) was *cr.*, by the titular King James III, 6 Oct. 1721, as "George Granville Esq," LORD OF LANSDOWN, Devon, VISCOUNT OF [—] co.[—], and EARL OF BATH, Somerset [E.,] with *rem.* to his heirs male, and on 3 Nov. following, as "George Granvill, commonly called LORD LANSDOWN, EARL OF CORBEIL AND LORD THORIGNI AND GRANVILLE in France and Normandy," he was *cr.* BARON LANSDOWN OF BIDEFORD, Devon, VISCOUNT BEVEL, EARL OF BATH, MARQUIS MONK AND FITZHEMON, and DUKE OF ALBEMARLE [E.], with a *spec. rem.* failing heirs male of his body, to his br. Bernard and the heirs male of his body. (e) He *d. s.p.m.*, 8 Jan. 1734/5. (f)

III. 1735 2. BERNARD (GRANVILLE), titular DUKE OF ALBEMARLE &c., nephew and h. under the *spec. rem.*, being to 1776. 1st s. of Bernard G. of Buckland, co. Gloucester, by Mary, da. of Sir Martin WESTCOMBE, 1st Bart. (1700), which last named Bernard was yr. br. of the late Duke. He was *b.* 1700; served in the Army; *suc.* his father 8 Dec. 1723, and his uncle 11 years later. He *d. unm.*, at Calwich, co. Stafford, 2 July 1776, when the Dukedom, and other honours *cr.* 3 Nov. 1721, became extinct, but those conferred on 6 Oct. of that year devolved on his h. male.

(d) According to *Anselme, ut supra*, (1733), she "se remaria à — Mahoni, Colonel Irlandois. Ce mariage fut tenu caché, afin qu'elle pût conserver le titre duchesse d'Albemarle." No confirmation has been found of this story. If she did marry Mahony, it must have been as her 2nd husband. V.G.
