I can't imagine how she had such a conglomeration of things so carelessly left around - Among the things were my grandfather's army record where he was honorably discharged after the 2<sup>nd</sup> Manassas battle, Traudman went up in a wagon and brought him home - They bought a home (plantation) in Monticello Fla. and he died there from the wound (bullet was never removed) in 1869. There are certificates of shares in the Port Royal R.R., being a member of 'Sanier's Wild Horse Taming Co., Masonic membership etc. and then parts of letters etc the newspaper clipping about somebody Peoples I had told you about was

So sad & crumbly it was in pieces - just a very small piece anyway - impossible to read or save - so I was delighted to find this one for you - I am sure the news must have been related - or maybe some of the other families - we have in common - where I was young Grandpa had many relatives who visited her - Leese, Spann, Hiers, Sanders etc, Bradshaw! The only Bellinger I know of was cousin Walter C Bellinger in Hendersonville S.C. who has a son Ed friend & daughter Bessie - the letter speaks of "Grandmother Smith" - she too was taking to trace the family - that was 58 years ago, the letter Grandpa's father was Serabee was son of Wm Serabee and Rowley Sarcigne - her mother Mary Mow daughter of Robert Mow (Jimmy) & Ann Rutledge Smith - they lived on a plantation called "The Ace of Diamonds" & they had 11 children by the name of my cousin found in Sar -

I have recently been going over some family papers, and am wondering if you are related to some of my Grandmother's family too - Her father was Wm. Seake of Bethany Plantation near Ridgeland S.C. Her mother was Mary New - daughter of McKaine New and Ann Rutledge Smith - whose father was James Smith & she was born during the siege of Savannah - My grandmother Gabriella Seake Dickson used to talk about a cousin Ferdine Peoples who came to visit there in great style, with coachman etc. Uncle Wilson Seake owned the land which is now Ocatee Club & all the Seakes owned timber land and property on the Ocatee River. (My grandmother got none however) They were related to the Belleflore



Sanders, etc - Her aunt Ann Jacobs <sup>with</sup> <sup>Grandma</sup>  
married Bureau Sanders - & I visited at  
Boone Hill Plantation at Ritter, where Cousin  
Caryll Sanders & his sister Cousin Eliza lived  
there - & Cousin Paul & Cleveland & their families  
were at Ritter - Cousin Otis Leacock - too -  
we have never been able to trace the James Smith  
tho' - My father Josiah Perry or Sewardville  
was descended from Robert Daville (Gov) and of  
course Thomas Smith - two of his grand children  
Thomas & Edith (first cousins) were my ancestors and  
I have one of their wedding spoons - with T, R, S.  
has been scattered around in the family - but it
