No grant of the arms borne by the family can be found. There was a grant to George Smith in 1590, but who he was or whether he was the Sir George Smith of Exeter the heralds cannot say. Assuming that they are right then no member of the family has any claim to the right of arms save the descendents of Sir George Smith. The Rt. How. Gav. Land grove Smith could not have used arms allegally.

Assuming there was no grant the Antiquity of the arms borne by the family would be proved by the way in which they are recorded in the visitation of

Devon in 1619 They are recorded as being the arms belonging to the family by prescripton that is by immemorial user.

Semper Fidelis - Motto of the city of Exeter. Arms were probably given

by Edward IV to Robt. Smith.

These arms are painted on the South Wall of the Exeter Cathedral under one of the aisle window, also in the Middle Temple Hall in behalf of Sir Nicholas Smith, Acct. Gen., Court of Chancery, in Lord Eldon's time. Continuously used by many distant branches of the family with small variations.

No family in lower S. C. is better known and more larger represented both by name and collaterally than the "Langrayes Smith." Thomas Smith, 1st. Langraye arrived in Charlestown 1684-Made landgraye 1691. Gov. 1693. His Oldest Son, 2nd. Landgrave Thomas Smith, Married twice and left 10 Sonsand 10 Daughters.

His heart Son, Dr. George Smith, Practised Medicine in Philadelphia Pa. George Smith, Practised Medicine in Phila Adam. Two most interesting relics of the two Landgraves are still extant (1901). One is the marriage certificate of the Gov. & 1st. Landgrave and the Baroness de Wernhaut, The other is a silver mounted doubled barrelled pistol owned by the 2nd Thomas Smith. The crest on this weapon has the chain given in the illustration. Arms Sa a fee erm, Cotised or, between three martlets of the last. Crest-A greyhound sejesut gu, collared and chained with a line reflected over the back or charged on the shoulder with an annulet or. Note: The fee ermine is from family plate.
