And for y^r so doing this shall bee y^r sufficient warr^t. given under our hands at Charle Towne this thirtieth Jan: 1676/

Lords Prop. etc. grant Thomas Stanyarne a plantⁿ containing 900 acres of land English measure on western branch of Wandoe River & bounding as per platte
14 July 1677
(950 A. Christchurch Parish) Entered 7 May 1678
(Stanyarne Folder-S.C.H. & G.Soc.)

May 10-1682

I Thomas Stanyarne of Charles Town merch't make this my last will being weak in body. Ap. my beloved wife executrix with son James Stanyarne this house and plantation I now (live) upon Charles Town Neck- $\frac{1}{2}$ my cattle-hogs-household stuff &c to my wife Mary Stanyarne for life. to my eldest son James Stanyarne sd dwelling &c-the other half equally between my 5 childⁿ James Stanyarne John Stanyarne Thomas Stanyarne W^m Stanyarne & Mary Ladson-land on Wandoe which I took up for my rights 1050 acres to be sold to pay debt I owe to Peleg Withington and overplus betw my 4 sons-Land on the s.w. side of Stono River wh I bought of Peleg Withington 400 equally divided betw. my 4 sons-I give jointly to my son James & his mother my mare which I used to ride on. To assembly of people called Quakers in prov of Carolina one heifer calf &c to Jonathan Fitch John Ladson & Edward Mayo for support of such poor friends as be living among them, &c to Mary Everit the second heifer & ex^{ors} to make inventory without oath.
