The Assembly continued consideration of the Circuit Court Bill.

Tuesday 3-29-1768. The bill was read to authorize Commissioners to cut a canal from the upper end of Broad Street into the Ashley River, and to reserve the vacant marsh on each side of the canal for the use of a common for Charles Town.

Bill to erect a new Work House and House of Correction in Charles Town, and to regulate the poor of the Province, was read. Committee was told to obtain a plan and estimate of cost before the bill was read again by the House.

Petition from owners and proprietors of the Swamp commonly called Cacaw Swamp, and land at the upper end of the swamp in St. Paul's Parish. On 5-8-1754 an act was passed naming commissioners to cut drains and water passages in the west branch of Stono River. Since that time work was begun, but some commissioners died, others sold their lands. Current landowners are not commissioners. They ask that new commissioners be named to cut and keep in repair a passage from the upper end of Spoon Savannah downwards to the NE part of lands formerly belonging to one CAPERS, and now MR. ARCHIBALD STANYARNE's, and another passage from that part of the road leaving from RANTOWLE's Bridge to FERGUSON's Ferry, bounded on each side by lands of Hon. JOHN DRAYTON, Esq. Referred to a committee of CAPT. GADSDEN, MR. FERGUSON, MR. BEE, MR. ELLIOTT, MR. WILLIAMSON.

Assembly again began reading the Circuit Court Act. The EARL OF SHELBURNE has written Governor MONTAGU about the pending Circuit Court Act which would phase out the Provost Marshal office and replace him with Sheriffs in the counties. The King approves the plan, only if the colony provides "a Compensation" to the current Provost Marshall.

Continued consideration of the Circuit Court Act.

Wednesday, 3-30-1768. Circuit Court Act was again considered.

Finally, the Assembly read and approved all changes in the Circuit Court Act and it was sent to the Council for their concurrence.

Thursday, 3-31-1768. The petitions from Hon. HENRY MIDDLETON, Esq., PAUL and SAMUEL PORCHER, and inhabitants of Day's Creek Swamp in St. Luke's Parish, and COL. DANIEL HEYWARD, all were considered by the committee.

The Committee invited the several petitioners to appear before them. Some came, others sent letters. The road would run along property lines except for one place where it would cut a corner about 12 acres of uncultivated swamp land in Mr. SEALY's tract of 500 acres. The male slaves of the 8 plantations belonging to WILLIAM and HENRY MIDDLETON, Esq. in that area were to work on the road until it was completed, helping those of the several other plantations which will benefit from its use. The plantation "Ticklebury" belonging to HENRY MIDDLETON, Esq. was to furnish male slaves to work the road to keep it in repair.
