SIMMONS.

Moses Simmons came from Holland in
the Fortune in the spring of 1621 that being
the first ship to arrive after the Mayflower.
Moses Symons (as the name was origi-
nally but now corrupted into Simmons)
came to Plymouth in the Fortune; and being
says Winslow "a child of one that was in
communion with the Dutch Church at
Leyden is admitted into Church fellowship
at Plymouth in New England & his child-
ren also to baptism as well as our own."
He was one of the first settlers of Dux-
bury and an original proprietor in Bridg-
water. His sons Moses & Thomas settled
the former in Duxbury where he died
in 1689, and the latter in Scituate where
he was a householder before 1647.

its value in negroes as my executors find

and a like sum in money or negroes to Sarah
Graves Daughter of John Graves of Beech hill
and £500 &c to Wm Graves son of Wm Graves
of Beech Hill and in case he die &c to Ann
daughter of John Andrews of Pon Pon, as for
the surplus I give it to my wife Sarah.

Lastly I appoint Mr John Smith, Mercht. of
this Parish & Mr James Donnom of St Bartho^mw.
parish, planter to be executors & impowering
them to buy, sell & clear lands &c belonging to
my said Child, or children &c 17 March 1750.

WILLIAM SIMMONS.

In the name & I William Simmons of Prince
Williams Parish, Granville County, province aforesd
Planter, being tho' not in Bodily health yet (Bles-
sed be to God &c) of sound and disposing mind &c
Principally I commend my soul &c as to the
worldly goods &c debts be paid &c. Item: my
will is that my wife Sarah should have her
living on the Plantation on which I now live
until my Son John Simmons arrives at the
age of nineteen years & likewise shall have
the Privilege of improving her Interest upon
the said Plantation during the said time
by putting on 15 working hands or joining
the said 15 hands with those of my Son.
Item: I give & bequeath unto my said Son
John Simmons the said Plantation or
tract of land whereon I now live contain-
ing 910 acres &c And his Interest to be im-
proved thereon till he comes to the age

of 19, and then to be taken possession of by him the sd John And in case he should die before that time I then give & said tract of land to my niece Elizabeth Simmons daughter of my Brth^r Thomas Simmons deceased, & to the heirs of her Body &c But if she die &c then to my nephew Thomas Bee & his &c Item: I give & bequeath to my loving wife Sarah all my household furniture excepting my Books which after my said wife Sarah has taken her choice of which Books she pleases, I will to be sold by my executors. I also give & beq^t to my said wife the Riding Chair & Horse Childers. Item: in case my wife Sarah should prove with Child my will is that all my personal estate at my disposal be equally divided between my wife Sarah and

her two Children share & share alike and I empower my executors to choose proper persons to make divisions. But if my said wife Sarah should not prove to be with child then I give and bequeath unto her all the slaves that I have received or have a right to by my Marriage with her (excepting Ruth & her youngest child Tom, sold to Jonathan Bryan in Georgia). I also give my wife my Men slaves Jemmy & Abnor & my women slaves Myrtilda & Moll, together with the Boys Sancho & Niger & a girl named Dianah &c. Item: I give to Stephen Bull, Esqr, & John Smith as trustees of the Independent or Congregational Church of Christ meeting at Stoney creek £400 &c And to my friend Dr Alexander Garden of Charles Town, Millers Gardeners Dictior any which he now has in possession.

Dear cousin Sarah

* * * I regret that
I can hardly help you in this matter
as I have been trying to find out for
a good while about the Simmmons & * *
I could not find out who was my great
father. I only know he came with his
wife from Ireland but from what part
was hidden * * no dates of the arrival
of the boy who was born at sea and land-
ed at Boston, he was called Ebenezer
and * * their son Ebenezer was blown
up in the Frigate Randolph in a fight
at night with the 64 gun ship Yarmouth
7 March 1778 off the Bermudas - this is the
only Simmons I hear or read of concern-
ed in that war. Father was only seven when
the war broke out. He was born on 18 April
1765. He married Sarah the daughter of Col.
Isaac Hayne the Martyr, died early in
