Dear Member:

I have wanted to write to you for some time to let you know how happy I am that you are a member of The Society of First Families of South Carolina 1670-1700, and also to let you know how much I have enjoyed my association with you. It has been a pleasure writing to each new member as he or she became a member, and to thank you for the many pleasant letters I have received from you since you joined The Society.

During the past four years The Society has accomplished much. Two Historical Markers have been erected and are beautiful and many people have congratulated the Society on erecting these markers. My thanks go to the Historical Marker Committee for this work. The first marker was placed on Bull's Island near the site of the landing of the ship Carolina on the shores of South Carolina. This marker was placed within the Cape Romain Refuge of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service. The second marker, in memory of Dr. Henry Woodward, was erected on the shores of the Ashley River in Magnolia Gardens in a beautiful setting where many tourists will see and admire it. We have had four delightful luncheon meetings and very excellent speakers.

The Society has had designed pins in gold and blue for the members at the low price of \$7.00 each, and also a hot plate tile with the Society's logo painted on it. These tiles are offered for sale at the General Assembly for \$3.50 each.

The enrollment of The Society now stands at 275, and I am enclosing a membership card in this letter so that you will be able to propose a new member during this last year of my administration. ## RULES FOR PREPARING LINEAGE PAPERS

### Both Papers to be returned to Registrar

1. Use full name of all persons. Give, if possible, place and date of birth, death and marriage of each ancestor in line of descent, with proof of same, beginning with yourself.
2. Give no approximate dates. Where the only definite dates known are those of wills, deeds or similar documents, give those dates in full. For instance, when the date of death is known only through a will, erase "died" and write "will dated" and "will probated," with dates for both.
3. When exact dates of birth and marriage are unobtainable, the facts of marriage and that the ancestor in question is the child of this marriage must be proven. This may be done by wills, deeds or other authentic records.
4. When reference is to family Bibles, certified transcripts or photocopies of all the records in each Bible cited must accompany the papers.
5. If reference is made to family records other than Bibles, certified or photocopies of these must be sent.
6. Photocopies of Church, town, county or other public records to which reference is made must accompany papers, and location, volume and page must be noted in every case. This applies both to published and unpublished material.
7. All published authorities must be accurately given with title, number and page of volume. Full transcripts must be furnished of all items quoted.
8. When portions of printed family genealogies are submitted as proof, photocopies of pertinent pages and title page **MUST** be submitted.
9. Lineage papers **MUST** be typed (no carbons). Write only on one side of any extra sheets submitted as evidence.
10. The Society will return one copy of the paper, when passed by the Genealogist, but not evidence.
11. The Genealogist reserves the right to judge as to the reliability of county and family histories and genealogies and of any parts thereof.

### MEMBERSHIP INFORMATION

1. The Life Membership fee is \$\_\_\_\_\_ and must accompany the candidate's lineage papers. Make check payable to the Society of First Families of South Carolina. If a claim is rejected because of insufficient proof, the fee, less \$15.00 for examination of papers, shall be returned to the candidate. There are no annual dues. Successor membership fee is \$\_\_\_\_\_ and must be paid at time of nominating Successor.


