

STROBHAR MEMORIAL MONUMENT

Face Side:

STROBHAR

1736 -- 1887

This land owned by Strobhar Family from time of settlement of Purysburg 1732 - 1736, by Jean Pierre Pury of Newfchatel, Switzerland. Here was family burying ground, known as "Arm Oak". Some graves are unmarked, especially burials during reconstruction period following war of 1861-1865.

Through courtesy of Okeetee Club this spot was cleared and fence erected by A. Douglass Strobhar of Savannah, Georgia, son of Henry A. and Susan Morcock Strobhar and grandson of Capt. and Mrs. Henry J. Strobhar and Dr. and Mrs. John C. Morcock.

(7) Sacred to the memory of Harriet, daughter of John and Catherine Strobhar, who died July 13, 1805 Age 2 years, 1 month, 13 days. Followed by verse-

(8) Sacred to the memory of James, son of John and Catherine Strobhar, who died October 3, 1805 Age 7 months, 7 days. Followed by verse-

(9) Sacred to the memory of Francis, son of John and Catherine, who died November 3, 1806 Age 4 years, 8 months, 8 days. Followed by verse-




