Dear Robert.

Just a note to thank you for your nice letter and Jenkins data enclosed. My typewriter is in the shop being fixed, I hope!, since my hand writing is atrocious, to say the least, I am resorting to this 'plebeian' attorney.

I am hoping to get my Jenkins data copied so that I can give it to the printer, I am a slow typist at best. I still lack some information on the present generation which I am trying to get, everyone these days is too busy to bother but would resent it if I ignored them.

The reason I wanted Mrs Scheiden's address is that I am hoping she might be able to give me some dates and also information on the Bythwood family. As I wrote you I am getting the Johnson date for Charlie Dauner, then too Dr John Johnson married my grandmother Talbird's sister, Claudia Christiana Talbird.

You mentioned your cousin Elvira Chaplin Porter, she must have been quite old when you knew her. She and her mother lived in the house just across the street from St. Helena's Church, on the south-west corner. I believe it still belongs to the Bosricks. Miss Elvira had a private school in those days and used to teach sewing in the summer, to which Therese and I and all of our friends attended when we were quite young. I have often wondered what became of her. Heyward, Sr. used to go to her school until his family moved to "The Point" they lived in Uncle John Johnson's house and we lived in our family home in the same block. Miss Elvira used to insist

that we call her "Cousin Elvira". I have some information
on the Porters if you want it. The St. Helena Records show that
Joseph Porter married Juliz Rhodes, NOV 8TH, 1847 at Chinese-Wit
Benjamin Johnson and Philip Givens. I remember Miss
Elvira saying that her mother, mother's grandmother was a
Tallard, but the only Rhodes I have listed who is single
is Mary Rhodes, b 28, Jan, 1793. The Bythewood date only
shows that Elizabeth Bythewood married Mr. Porter and their
son Joseph mar. Miss Rhodes. This research business can
be very confusing and expectancy.

I wrote Mrs Faunt about the James Bowman marriage to
Ann Black, "she said that the diary in the original ms. has
that ANN Black married to Mr. Bowman & 2nd to Mr. Bythewood
Mr. Black, the father of the present owner, annotated & corrected
the original ms. he inserted the name James (Bowman) 2nd
John (Bythewood), and was obviously wrong if the records have
Thomas." Re. John Beacraft, Sheriff, you have, I quote: "I think
he was probably a nephew of John Beacraft who married Mary
Doherty, younger sister of Capt. James Doherty". Where did you
find the names John and Mary Beacraft? I do not have the
names for either one. I have written Marie Williams
twice about having a typed copy made of the Tallard letter,
I was sending something to her in my second letter so added
that. The original will probably have first names.

You mentioned that you do not have information
on the family of Lawrence E. Dawson, I have done on his
father and grand-father if you are interested.

you mentioned having a cousin here in Oneando (Mrs. Charles Forest Summer) Mr. Charles Bowman's daughter married a Summer. Their son T. Roy Summer has never answered my letters, which reminds me that I sent the above date to Mr. McConnell and never received an answer to my letter.

In one of Marie Williams' letters she mentioned that Jack Ladson told her that he thought a Miss or Mrs. Strain of H.H.S. could help me as to the Ladson family that she was interested in the Talbot line. She could not remember the first name. Then goes on to say, I quote; "I think he said she knew of a marriage of one of them to Mary Ladson." Do you by any chance know the lady in question? Marie also said that one copy of the letter she has states John Talbot married Mary Ladson and one states that her name was Ann. She is none too clear in what she writes.

I have ordered from a book store in Columbia a copy of the book "Carolina Gardens" by E.T.H. Shaffer of W.A.T. S.C. He mentions the lovely gardens on Hutchinson Island where my grandmother Talbot was married, she was visiting Mrs. Phoebe ~~the widow~~ I suppose above several books which are now out of print among them was "Prince Williams, 2nd Plantations" by F.M. Hudson. They had a "good used" copy for \$100⁰⁰. I decided I did not need that. Do you by any chance own a copy? I have also ordered a copy of the "Minutes of the Vestry of St. Helena's Parish, 1726-1812". Do you get "Lists of Publications of the S.C. Archives Dept."? I have bought several books through that department.

Heyward has to go to S.C. on business sometime next month, hope I can see you there. He is hoping to stay a week, but is quite busy in his office here at present so has made no definite plans. I received a letter from Trinice today asking me to spend awhile with her but that is not possible. Thanks for all of your help, will love to both of you
