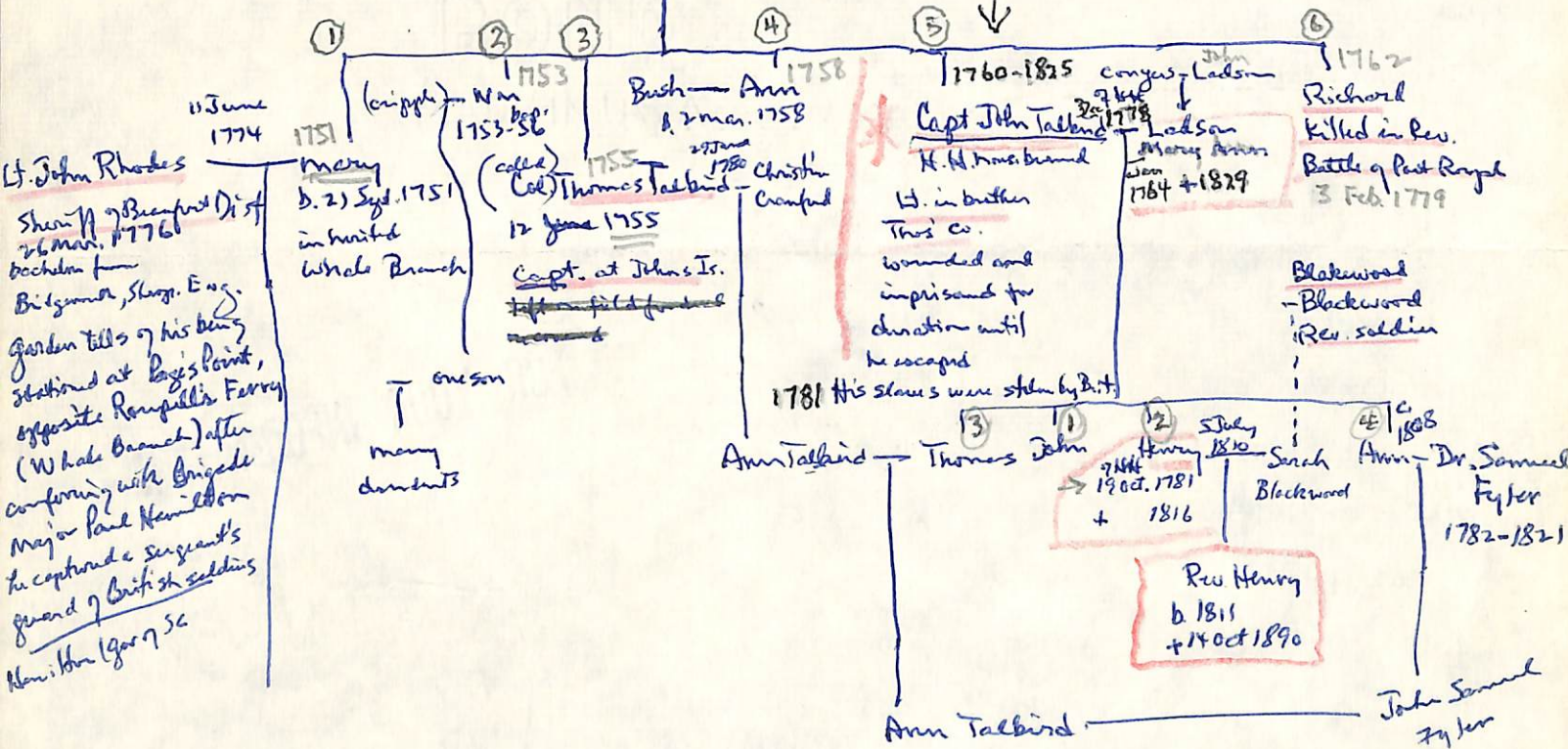


Massy Mansona (E) Henry Talbird 1750

Lighthouse for which he received grant of land on 1748

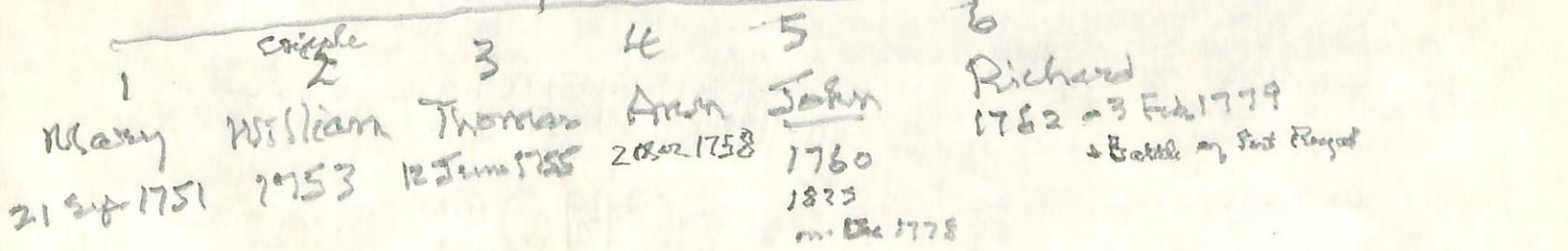

* Edward Wilkinson + 1771 mar. Ann Numan; he was son of Francis Wilkinson (and Margaret Arden), son of Christopher Wilkinson (1679-1732) who m. 23 Dec. 1701 Elizabeth Morton (widow of Daniel Curtis), a granddau. of Gov. Joseph Morton.
