Find parents of Robert Thomas, b. about 1763 Caswell County, NC; married Margaret Warwick

Information Provided:

o DAR Patriot Index, Centennial Edition part 3, page 2918 shows THOMAS, Robert² b c1763 NC d 1810 NC m Margaret Warwick PVT NC. The proof is from the North Carolina Historical Commission, NC Revolutionary Army Accounts Vol VI, page 11, folio 2. [haven't found this entry yet and the MARS catalog index is a little wimpy – would need to look at WPH indexes for all volumes, manually, probably not needed at this time] [looked at WPH books – there is no entry that seems to correlate to page 11, folio 2 in Volume VI – though, there are two entries for a Robert Thomas in this book – except it is clearly stated that the found Robert Thomas was in Davidson county at the time of the entry] – this "could" be possible since most Rev War

There was a "Robert Thomas" who served the NC line and then moved to Davidson TN (probably had a military land grant since that is the area where they were located) [source: http://www.footnote.com/image/#28136209 Rev War pension for James Wilson] —

it was a person asking for multiple pensions of which this was one of the names.



payments were made c. 1783ish and we don't have Robert buying land in Caswell until 1788, 1 year after marrying there.3

o 1937 DAR Application (Dorothy Thomas Conyers) based on Robert Thomas service confirms the children of Robert and Margaret Warwick from the bible of John Warwick Thomas (a son) in the possession of John Romulus Thomas of Tenille, Georgia at the time. The children were <u>David</u>, <u>Robert, Mary, Sarah, John Warwick, and Jane</u>. It also states that *Robert's residence during the Revolution was Watauga Dist, NC [still struggling to confirm this – there is a Watauga County, much further west, in TN there was a Watauga settlement/district in the 1770s ... "where" is this referring to?]*

I also found references to a David Thomas in Caswell, but no definitive linkage to Robert, even though he named his first son David.

Comments/Notes/Questions:

- o Caswell was formed from Orange county in 1777
- Both Caswell and Orange Counties have pretty good surviving collections of original (and microfilm records) at the NC Archives, though "Some records were said to have been destroyed during occupation by militia troops during Reconstruction"
- o Rev War Payment Records do NOT typically indicate location or provide any identifying information
- o Many like-named individuals historically got mixed up in DAR/SAR applications that is changing and as new descendants try to connect to certain individuals, additional proofs are being required

Challenges:

- Missing or non-surviving records, e.g., for Caswell County Some records were said to have been destroyed during occupation by militia troops during Reconstruction.
- Name variants and usage
- There was a period from 1763 to about 1779 where no land grants were issued in the "Granville" District as Lord Granville's dispute with the King took time to resolve and then the American Revolution was resolved. This means that for these years, many individuals lived on land and paid taxes on land that they did not necessarily "own" on paper. Once the state started re-issuing land grants, there was a rush to do so c. 1778/1779 and many had moved on, died, or never did get "land grants" for the land they had occupied and worked.

Initial Research Plan; [NOTE: √ = completed, X = not done]

- √ Review all information provided by you (family tree on ancestry and either documents or timeline (see note below) as provided by you)
- o √ Double-check MARS to make sure no entries for Robert Thomas the only entries found are for a Robert Thomas with land grants in Anson county from 1769 through 1780 given Robert's purported birth c. 1763 he would have reached majority c. 1784 [I suspect the basis for the birth year is the 1784 tax list where Robert is listed as reported later need to see if any pre-1784 tax lists survive or other records that might support or refute these dates]
- √ Double-check Linkpendium to make sure no records have been recently digitized for Caswell county
- Check Footnote.com make sure not listed in someone's pension application or other Rev War documentation ("Robert Thomas" + Carolina + Colonies & Revolution to 1815]
- √ Perform a book survey of Caswell county at the State Library of North Carolina looking at any relevant books beyond deeds and wills, such as [unless you exhaustively looked at these already at the DAR library]
- √ Perform a book survey of Orange county at the State Library of North Carolina given that
 Caswell county was only formed 10 years before his marriage, it makes sense to see what prerevolutionary Thomas families might be found there) there is an extensive collection of books
 encompassing pre-1800 Orange County
- √ Caswell County original records at the North Carolina State Archives [given that you have looked at deed and will books, these will be skipped for now assuming that you provide a summary of what you looked at and what you learned]. The records that will be looked at include and/are not limited to:
 - VLoose estate records for the Thomas surname

- √ Lists of Taxables 1777-1867 [start with 1787 and go backwards first it will help age him
 and possibly connect him to a father and then possibly go forwards]
- √ Grantor/Grantee indices ... though there are abstracted books covering early deeds, just double-check the county-created indexes [Caswell has online access for some period I am not able to access this to determine what the scoop is, http://www.caswellrod.net/]
- Based on what is learned in items #1-#4, look at similar records held for Orange County (the predecessor county)
- Other records TBD there are Misc, CRX, Civil Action Paper, Road Records and other "original records" [are there any militia records?] which are un-indexed and hand-written that can be great sources of information and which are not examined until the "easier-to-navigate" records have been first consulted.

2nd Phase of Research (initial plan):

- o √ (started) since <u>Robert</u> and <u>David</u> Thomas are in the same tax district, focus some research on David
- o $\sqrt{\text{(started)}}$ since <u>Robert</u> and <u>Thomes</u> Thomas are briefly in the same tax district, look at him also
- o √ (see notes below) where is Robert in the 1790 census he was a land owner and had children he should be listed as a "head of household" ... want to see who else is listed near him since the tax lists do not provide that perspective
- o √ (started) look at other early Caswell record groups not yet consulted
- o (see notes below) look at where land was in Caswell county Caswell is a NC/VA border county did they migrate "down" from Halifax or Mecklenburg or Pittsylvania counties in VA?
- o (see notes below) other records TBD

Project Conclusions:

- Robert is found in the tax records of Caswell county starting in 1789.
- This is consistent with his purchasing land from his father-in-law in late 1788
- Before this date, he is not found in the Caswell county tax records, though we know he married in Caswell county in late 1787.
- It may be that Robert is younger than we thought maybe not yet 21 when he married.
- The tax district where he is initially found does contain other Thomas' <u>David</u> and <u>Thomas</u> can we connect Robert to one or both of these as a sibling and/or parent?
- There is a William Thomas (snr) who lived in Pittsylvania County VA and had several sons. No Robert, though he had sons Asa, Philip, William etc and Philip and William end up in Richmond District, the same district where Robert is found – could they be cousins?
