

Lineage of Trowell families to America

Thomas Trowell, born in England, buried 8 August 1748, St. Phillips Parish, Charleston, South Carolina. His wife Elizabeth is buried 8 Aug. 1748 St. Phillips Parish, Charleston, S. C. - from the South Carolina Magazine, Vol. 42.

Their sons, John and William enlisted in Revolutionary War under General George Washington and served at Valley Forge.

-dates are from the Will and probate of Thomas Trowell.

John Trowell enlisted in the Revolutionary War of Capt. John Sumner's Company of the first North Carolina Battalion, Commanded by Col. Thomas Clark.

1703 James Trowell claimed land in Orange Co.

1713 South Carolina separated from North Carolina.

1715 Joseph Jr. was born to Joseph and Tobitha Trowell.

1720 Joseph Paid Taxes on 400 acres.

1720 Joseph Trowell paid to John Harrison for 100 acres in Chowan Pct.

1723 South Carolina became a Royal Colony.

1722, 4 Apr. Joseph bought 150 acres in Matescomack Hammock.

1730 Immigrants came in to Santoo, S. C.

1735 Joseph Jr. had cattle branded, and was made executor to Father's Will.

- 1796 James had 350 acres and 2 slaves in Jefferson Co, Ga. on Big and Cheavers Creek.
- 1816 James Trowell age 55 married Alcey Mattox in Anderson Co. Tenn.
- 1821 James Trowell was in Jefferson Co. Ga. ---from Tax records
- 1844, March 11, James Trowell bought ,*,1,520 acres adjoining lands of John Youman, James Trowell, Owens, N. Ellis, Reddin Deleach, for \$1,410,00. Barnwell Co. Abstracts . BB 165 Aldrich to James and Sarah Trowell.
- 1850, August 4, James Trowell died Anderson Col Tenn.

Colonial records of Georgia 1763-1766. pg 277, 297, 516.
Feb. 1765, 5day.

A petition of James Trowell setting forth that he was lately come into this province from South Carolina. He desires 250 acres for cultivation, having a wife and 2 sons. South side great Ogeechee joining the flat ford.

Petition rejected.

March 1765

A petition of James Trowell setting forth that he was removed into this province from South Carolina, having a wife and 2 children, on North side of Ogeechee about 4 miles from flat Ford and 2 miles from _____

Ludwig Eratz.

Petition granted on his giving security for his good behavior for a year.

Georgia, a council in Savannah 3 Dec. 1771.

A petition of James Trowell setting forth that he had been ten years there had a wife and 3 children, for his two sons Joseph and Jonathan. 150 acres in St. Matthew's parish.

Petition granted.

Georgia Gazette, Savannah, 22 June 1774, pg 3, Col. 1.

Among others,,, James Trowell of St. Matthews parish, planter, were summons to appear as Petit Jurors at this court, but they failed to appear. It is therefore ordered that they be respectively fined not exceeding 4 pounds.
