Waugens, translated Wiggins, migrated from Holland in 1776, later settling in Pennsylvania. Uriah Wiggins and family moved South in 1802, through Kansas and Missouri. Mason Lee, the oldest son, stopped at St. Louis and leased the ferry for 99 years. The family moved on into Mississippi. At Roseneith, Mississippi, Uriah, the second son, secured for his wife a Choctaw Indian girl by the name of Parthena and came to Louisiana in the fall of 1803, settling in Catahoula (Now in Belle) Parish and became a Methodist Circuit Rider. Their children were Uriah, William, Moses, Parthena, Ruth and Alfred.

Another family by the same name (Wiggins) moved to the same community from North Carolina later. The head of this family was George Wiggins, whose oldest son Uriah John married Parthena, the daughter of Uriah and Parthena. To this marriage were born Moses Madison, Daniel, Mary Ann, Martha Jane, George Washington and Elizabeth.

Elizabeth Adams Wiggins, wife of Abijah Wiggins of Henry County, Ala., was a daughter of Nancy Manning Adams and Hopewell Adams of Washington County, Ga. She was a first cousin of Charity Mayo Wiggins, who was a daughter of Elizabeth Manning Mayo and William Mayo, and wife of George Wiggins of Washington Co., Ga.

Their grandmother was Pheraly Duggan Manning, wife of Benjamin Manning of Bertie County, N. C. Pheraly Duggan Manning, was a daughter of William Duggan and Mary Smithwick Duggan, who was a daughter of John Smithwick, a son of Edward Smithwick and a grandson of Hugh Smithwick one of the very first men to come to North Carolina from Norfolk County, Virginia as early as 1691.

A book on Manning family has been written by Miss Elizabeth Ann Wright of Dallas, Texas who spent many years assembling family data. Therefore, all the descendants of Charity Mayo Wiggins and all the descendants of Nancy Adams Wiggins can trace their ancestry back to Hugh Smithwick in this book.

WILKINSON FAMILY

Carlos E. Wilkinson was b Near Clopton, Ala. in Barbour County on August 22, 1876. He was one of five boys b to Samuel and Malinda Helms Wilkinson. His parents d when he was young and his mother's sister, Mrs. George Wiggins and Mr. Wiggins, reared him.

Mr. Wilkinson attended grade school in Barbour County and later got his teaching certificate from Abbeville A. S. Normal School. He taught school for several years in Barbour, Henry and Houston Counties.

In 1901, Mr. Wilkinson bought a small farm near Headland. On February 22, 1902, he and Miss Erin Arnold, daughter of Reverend R. T. Arnold, were united in m and immediately came

to live near Headland. Six children were b to this union, one dying in infancy. Mrs. Wilkinson d December 16, 1919 and later Mr. Wilkinson m her sister, Miss Ola Arnold.

Mr. Wilkinson continued to acquire extensive farm land in Henry and Houston Counties in Alabama and also Seminole and Miller Counties in Georgia. He was a leader in diversified farming in this section. The breeding and growing of Toole Wilt Resistant Cotton was a specialty, shipping these seeds to all sections of the Southern states. He first promoted the use of nitrate of soda on cotton, corn, peanuts, etc. as well as being the first to use poison for boll weevils in this section.

In addition to farming Mr. Wilkinson became interested in the Cotton Gin and Warehouse business, operating gins in Headland, Henry Co., Dothan and Webb in Houston County.

Mr. Wilkinson was a leader in the Headland Baptist Church serving as Chairman of the Board of Deacons for a number of years. He served two terms in the Headland City Council. He was a charter member of the Kiwanis Club and very active in club work until illness retired him in 1951. He d at the age of 81 on November 7, 1957.

Mr. Wilkinson is survived by his wife, Mrs. Ola Wilkinson, five children: Mrs. Charles K. Grice, Nashville, Tennessee; Mrs. J. B. Davis, Dothan, Ala.; W. C. Wilkinson, Headland, Ala.; Mrs. A. P. Fuquay, Jr., Montgomery, Ala., and Mrs. Jeff C. Davis, Montgomery, Ala. He is further survived by eleven great-grandchildren.

WILLIAMS FAMILY

George Washington Williams, a graduate of Columbia College, S. C. holds the high place in the annals of Henry County. He was b in Abbeville District, S. C. 1803, d October 13, 1891, Henry Co., Ala.; taught school in Ft. Gaines, Ga. In 1825, returned to Columbia College in S. C. where he finished his education. A record in Deed Book AB.; George W. Williams was county surveyor in 1847, came to Abbeville after having finished his education, and studied law in S. C. He was the first county Supt. of Education of Henry County and the third Probate Judge of the County from 1855 to 1892. Though not consecutively, he served thirteen terms in the state Legislature.

It is remarkable that he held so many offices in the county during a life and so strongly was Henry County identified with the cause of states Rights and Secession, though advanced age for military service, he made liberal contributions to the Confederate Army. He was a soldier in the Indian War of 1806-07.

WIGGINS FAMILY

Daniel Wiggins, for whom Wiggins Church near Grimes was named, came with his large family to Henry County, with his son

in law, Redden Parwick, in 1826. He was b in North Carolina in 1780. The son is Danny Wiggins. About 1798, he moved with his mother to Darlington County, South Carolina, where he m Susanne Truitt, b in South Carolina in 1782. In South Carolina, he was a neighbor of the Woodhams, Alexanders, Parwicks, and others who later came to Henry County, residing in that portion near Sum in present Lee County, S. C. In 1817, he moved to then Sumter now Lee County, near present Bishopville, where his mother d in 1806. About 1802, he moved with his family to Washington County, Ga., prompted in Mississippi. returned to Georgia and after the m of his daughter, Nancy, to Redden Parwick moved to Henry County. Family tradition says that he bought, lived and d in the first Henry County jail at old Richmond, after Dale County was formed and that location was just over the line from Henry, though as late as 1851 he owned lands near Curton's Bridge, Wiggins District of Washington County, Ga., where his son, Abigail, was a Militia Captain in 1827-28, was named after him and his family. In South Carolina, he appeared in many purchases and sales of land in Darlington and Sumter Counties, was apparently pretty well educated for his day and time, and was named executor under the will of Edward Woodham, Sr. to whom he was apparently related and had been a neighbor in N. C. His and Susanne's descendants are numerous in Henry, Dale, Georgetown and other counties of Alabama, north west Florida, Georgia and Texas.
