THE WYMAN FAMILY (HAY - WYMAN)

Several years ago there appeared in the Columbia State Magazine an interesting article, entitled: "After Joel . . . came twenty-six other Physicians", nearly all of them graduated from the South Carolina Medical College at Charleston.

The record probably cannot be equalled in all this country.

Joel Wyman, the first of the family to come South, was born in Worcester, Massachusetts, December 6, 1800. He graduated at Amherst College with honors and received his M. A. Degree from there in 1828.

After graduation, he accepted a position as tutor at the Boiling Springs Academy, Barnwell County, South Carolina.

In a letter to his brother in Massachusetts he wrote: "As for myself, I am very pleasantly situated. I board with a genteel family by the name of Hay. He is very wealthy and has a family of fine children. He, as well as his lady, is very friendly to me providing every comfort. He originated from New York

and lives very much after the Northern style. I would exchange my position for none other in the country."

This is to be understood when we know how infatuated he became with one of the loveliest members of the Hay family, Catherine Clementine Hay, whom he later married.

Joel Wyman graduated in medicine in what was believed to be the first class to finish at the South Carolina Medical College 1831 and won the highest honors. The South Carolina Medical Society presented him with a handsome hand-made silver urn for the best Latin Thesis.

About a year after graduating, he married Catherine Clementine Hay, daughter of Lewis Scott Hay and Harriet Yonge Johnson (Hay). Six sons and three daughters were born to them.

I. William Hutson Wyman, the first physician son of Dr. Joel Wyman, Sr., graduated from the South Carolina Medical College in 1858. He was a surgeon in the Confederate Army and married Sarah Edwards. They had one physician son, Dr. Joel Wyman who graduated in 1881. Father and son died at a relatively young age in the practice of medicine.

II. Lallah Wyman, the oldest daughter of the first Joel, married Walter D. Smith, attorney. He died while serving as cavalry lieutenant in the Southern Army. Through the marriage of their daughter, Helen Smith, to Dr. C. P. Vincent, a graduate of the Medical College in 1885, there was born Dr. C. P. Vincent, Jr., who had a son, Dr. C. P. Vincent, III. The last is a great, great grandson of the original Joel Wyman and practices in Camden, South Carolina. From the first Dr. Vincent, there is another great, great grandson, Dr. Hugh Vincent.

III. Dr. Benjamin Wyman, medical graduate in 1869. Also served in the War as Captain in the 11th South Carolina Regiment, Hagood's Brigade. He married Mary Edwards and they had a daughter, Florence Wyman, who married Dan Crossland, and had a daughter, Mary, who married W. D. McNair, Sr. From this last marriage came Dr. W. D. McNair, Jr., practicing physician of Aiken, South Carolina, a great, great grandson of the first Joel.

IV. Holbrook Wyman, son of the original Joel Wyman, was not a physician himself, but had three sons and six grandsons who followed the profession. He married Clara Vincent and they had a number of children among whom the three physicians:

Weatherbee. He graduated as physician in 1890 and had two sons follow him:

1. Dr. Hugh Wyman of the class of 1925.
2. Dr. Joel Wyman, class of 1943.

These were great grandsons of the first Dr. Joel Wyman.

B. Joel Wyman, another son of Dr. Holbrook Wyman, Sr., graduated in medicine in 1892. He married Ann Lucas Maybank and they lived in Denmark, South Carolina. Their descendants are given on the Maybank line.

C. Delacy Wyman graduated in 1900. He married Allene Lawton and practiced medicine in Lena, South Carolina. There were several children, among whom a physician, Dr. Edward Holbrook Wyman graduated in 1931.

D. Catharine Wyman, daughter of Holbrook Wyman, Sr., married the Reverend Dudley Jones, D. D. They had two sons to become physicians. There were also other children. Dr. Dudley Jones, Jr. graduated in 1934, and Dr. Parker Jones in 1943. These were great grandsons of the first Dr. Joel Wyman.

V. Marion Hay Wyman and

VI. Hastings Wyman were twin sons of Dr. Joel Wyman and his wife Clementine Hay. They were attending a military Academy and ran away to join their older brothers in the army of Virginia in 1861. They were not quite sixteen years old. Hay Wyman was mortally wounded in one of the engagements around Petersburg in 1863. The surviving twin, Hastings Wyman, served with the Confederate army until the end of the war. Afterwards he graduated at the South Carolina Medical College in 1875. He married first, A. Edwards; second, Martha Davis and third, Marian Aldrich. There were children and three physicians among them:

A. Dr. Harry Wyman graduated in medicine in 1897. He has practiced in Aiken, South Carolina.

B. Dr. Benjamin Wyman, Jr. finished in 1915. He is a practicing physician of Columbia, South Carolina and is now head of the State Board of Health. His son, Dr. Benjamin Wyman, III, followed him in his profession, graduating in 1950—a great grandson of Dr. Joel Wyman.

C. Dr. Marion Hay Wyman (second Hay boy) is a Specialist in Columbia, South Carolina. Graduated from the medical college in 1910.

VII. Gertrude Wyman, daughter of the first Dr. Joel Wyman, married Howard Vincent and had children—one a pharmacist son—Howard Vincent, Jr.
