Extract of By-Laws of the Saint Andrew's Society of Upper South Carolina, P. O. Box 1404, Greenville, S. C. 29602
(As Dated January 25, 1976)

— APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP —

ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Members. Membership shall consist of men who are 18 years or over and who were born in Scotland or who are lineally descended from one or more natives of Scotland by blood or marriage.

(a) **Active Resident Members.** Except as otherwise provided membership in the Society shall be limited to 150 persons who reside within a radius of 50 miles of the city of Greenville, South Carolina

(b) **Active Non-Resident Members.** In addition to active resident members, the membership may include not more than 50 active non-resident members. A non-resident is defined as any person who lives outside a radius of 50 miles of the city of Greenville, South Carolina.

(c) **Associate Members.** To qualify as an associate member, a member must have held active membership for 25 years or have reached the age of 65 years, whichever occurs sooner.

When a member qualifies for associate membership, he will have the privilege of submitting a written request to be put in this category if such is his desire.

An associate member will pay no dues and have no rights with respect to the operation of the society.

An associate member will be notified when a dance is to be held and will have the privilege of attending by the payment of a guest fee. Request to the secretary for an invitation is to be made at least two weeks prior to the date of the dance.

An associate member will have the privilege of inviting a guest to the Annual Tartan Ball.

(d) **Inactive Members.** Any active member in good standing who, because of age, ill health, or other infirmity, is determined to be incapacitated for any reason and, therefore, unable to participate in any of the Society's activities, may be designated an inactive member by the Board of Directors, who may reduce or suspend the inactive member's dues during the period of his incapacity. Eligibility for inactive membership shall terminate whenever the member ceases to be incapacitated.

(e) **Honorary Members.** The Board of Directors may in its discretion elect honorary members, of which there shall be no more than 10. Honorary members shall not be required to pay dues, and shall have all the rights and privileges of active members, except the right to hold elective office, and be subject to all other provisions of these by-laws as are applicable to active members.

Section 1. Election to Membership. Any person desiring to become a member of the Society must make written application on a form provided for this purpose by the Society, together with the required resume. Each applicant must be vouched for by at least two members in good and regular standing in the Society. All applications will be submitted to the Secretary-Treasurer, who shall read aloud the applications in the order in which they are received at the close of the next regular meeting immediately prior to adjournment.

The applications and resumes will then be immediately submitted to the Membership Committee which shall be a committee of seven, composed of the Vice President of the Society, who shall be chairman, and six other members, two to be appointed by the President each year for a term of three years. The Secretary-Treasurer will list the names of proposed members in a letter sent to the membership announcing the meeting at which the names are to be first read to the Society.

Subsequent to the meeting, at which applications are read, the Membership Committee will meet and consider the applications of all persons presented at that meeting. The Committee will receive written comments on proposed members within a thirty (30) day period immediately following the meeting at which the applications are read. Members who wish to appear before the Committee to support or oppose an applicant, must do so by notifying the Vice President within the same thirty (30) day period.

The Membership Committee shall investigate and then approve or disapprove each applicant. Four affirmative votes of the Committee are required to approve an applicant. Persons not receiving four affirmative votes cannot be brought before the Committee again except on a new application.

Approved applicants' names will be placed on a waiting list and will be eligible for membership when a vacancy occurs. The names of those candidates receiving a favorable vote shall be recorded by the Secretary-Treasurer in the order of approval by the committee on two lists; one list of nephews, brothers, sons or sons-in-law of members of the Society and one list of other applicants. The Committee Chairman will immediately notify the Secretary-Treasurer and sponsors of action taken on his applicant. If the applicant is approved, the Secretary-Treasurer and sponsors will so notify the applicant. Upon the occasion of a vacancy, or vacancies, the Secretary-Treasurer shall notify an applicant for each of such vacancies who has received prior approval of the Society, and extend on behalf of the Society an invitation to fill the existing membership vacancy or vacancies. The Secretary-Treasurer shall begin with the name on the top of the list of nephews, brothers, sons and sons-in-law of members of the Society and shall alternate with the names on the top of the list of other applicants. All such vacancies in the Society shall be filled in like manner.

Section 3. Initiation Fee and Dues. Every applicant for active membership receiving a favorable ballot may become a member of the Society by the payment of an initiation fee and payment of the annual dues. Annual dues shall be payable on or before June 1 of each year.

Section 4. Termination of Membership. Active, non-resident, inactive, associate or honorary membership may be revoked for just cause after a hearing and unanimous vote by the board of directors. As of July 1 of each year the names of the active members whose dues are in arrears for the previous year shall be removed from the roll of members; provided that such members shall first, by notice, be given an opportunity to continue their membership by paying within 30 days of the date of notice, both the dues in arrears and the current due.

ARTICLE V

Section 1. General. To constitute and provide funds for the charitable and educational purposes of the Society, each applicant on being elected a member shall pay to the Secretary-Treasurer the sum of \$50.00 initiation fee and the regular annual membership fee, which amount shall be set from time to time by the Board of Directors. There shall also be made an assessment of each member attending the Annual Tartan Ball or other Social function of the organization.
